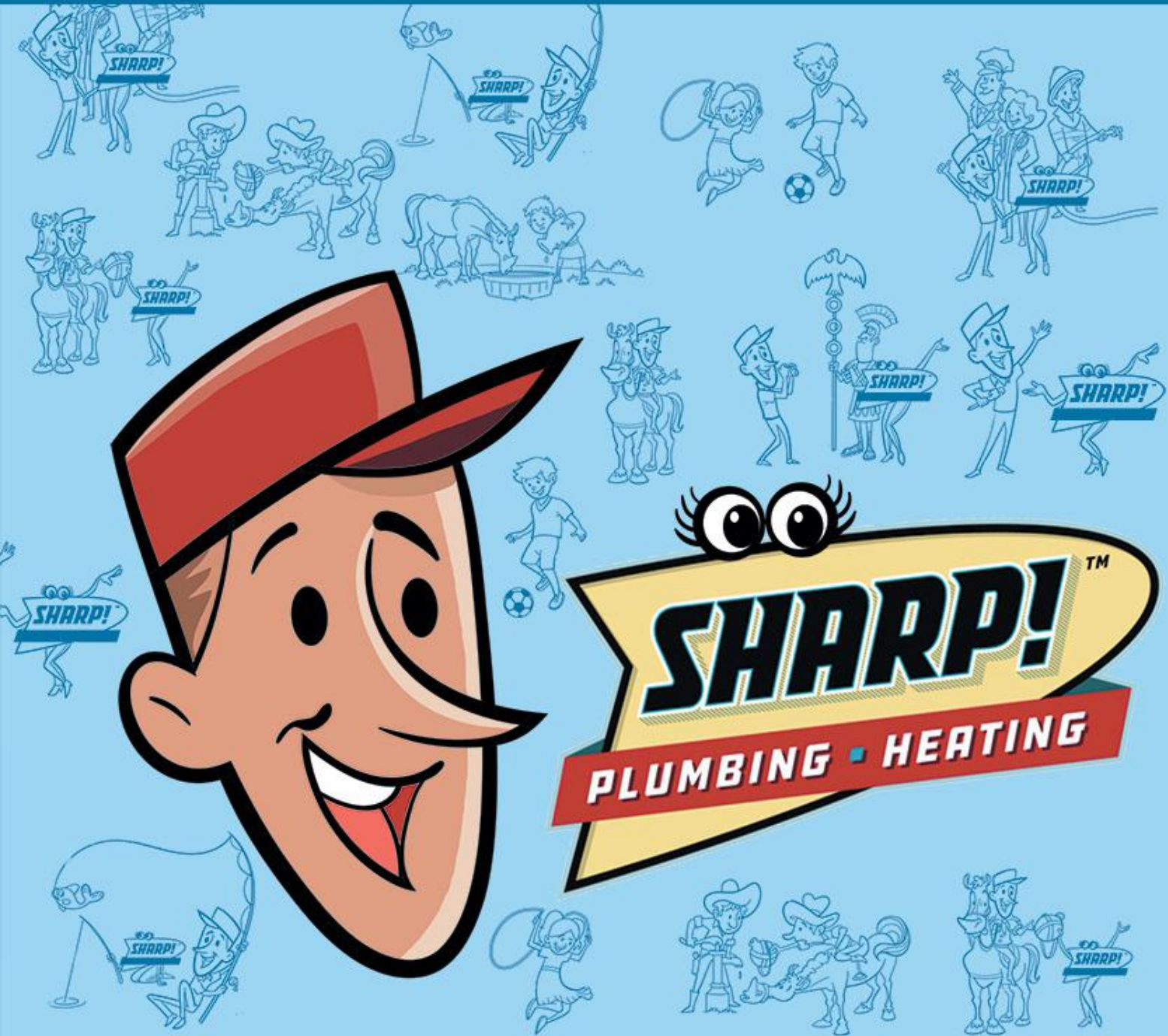

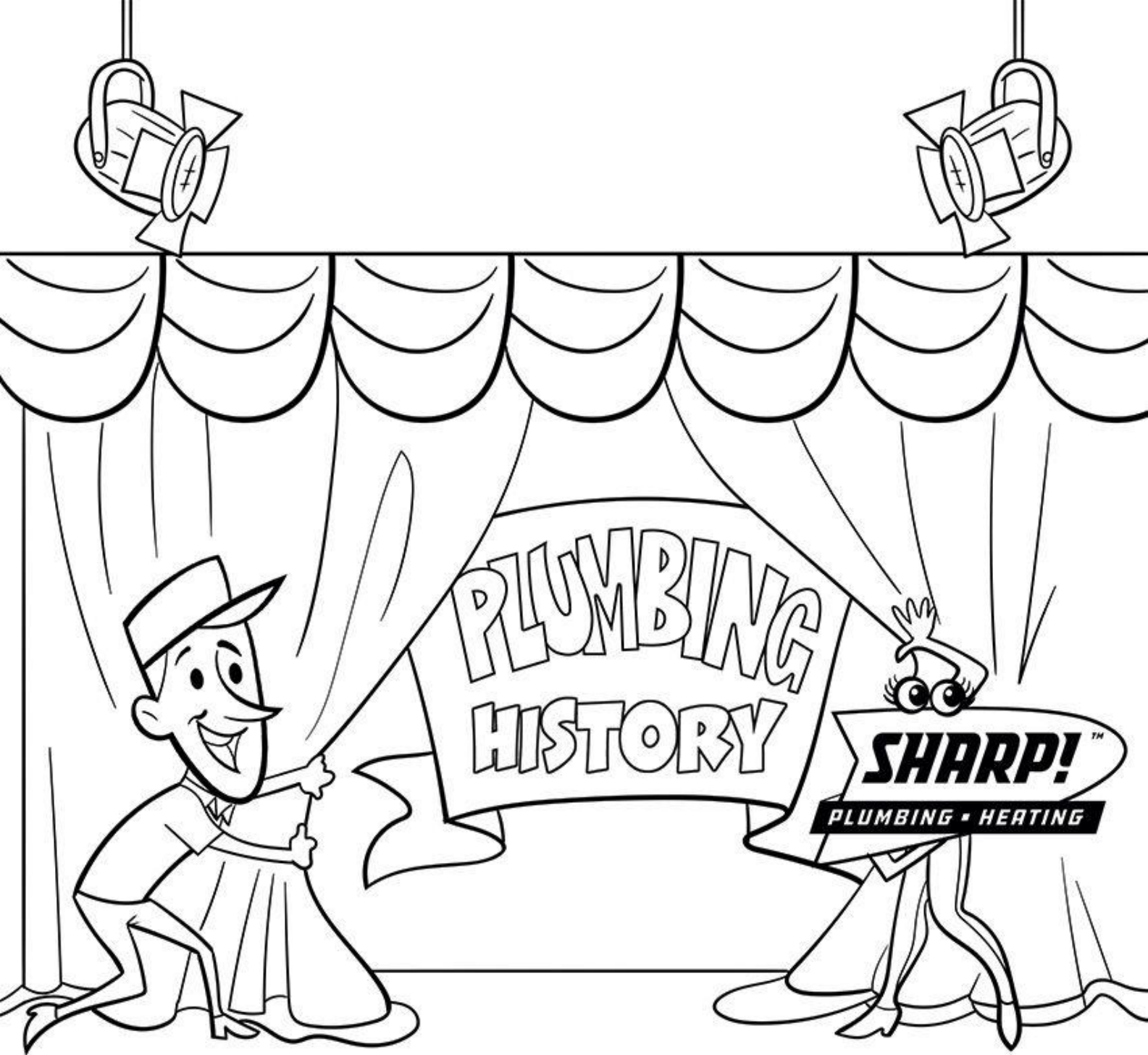

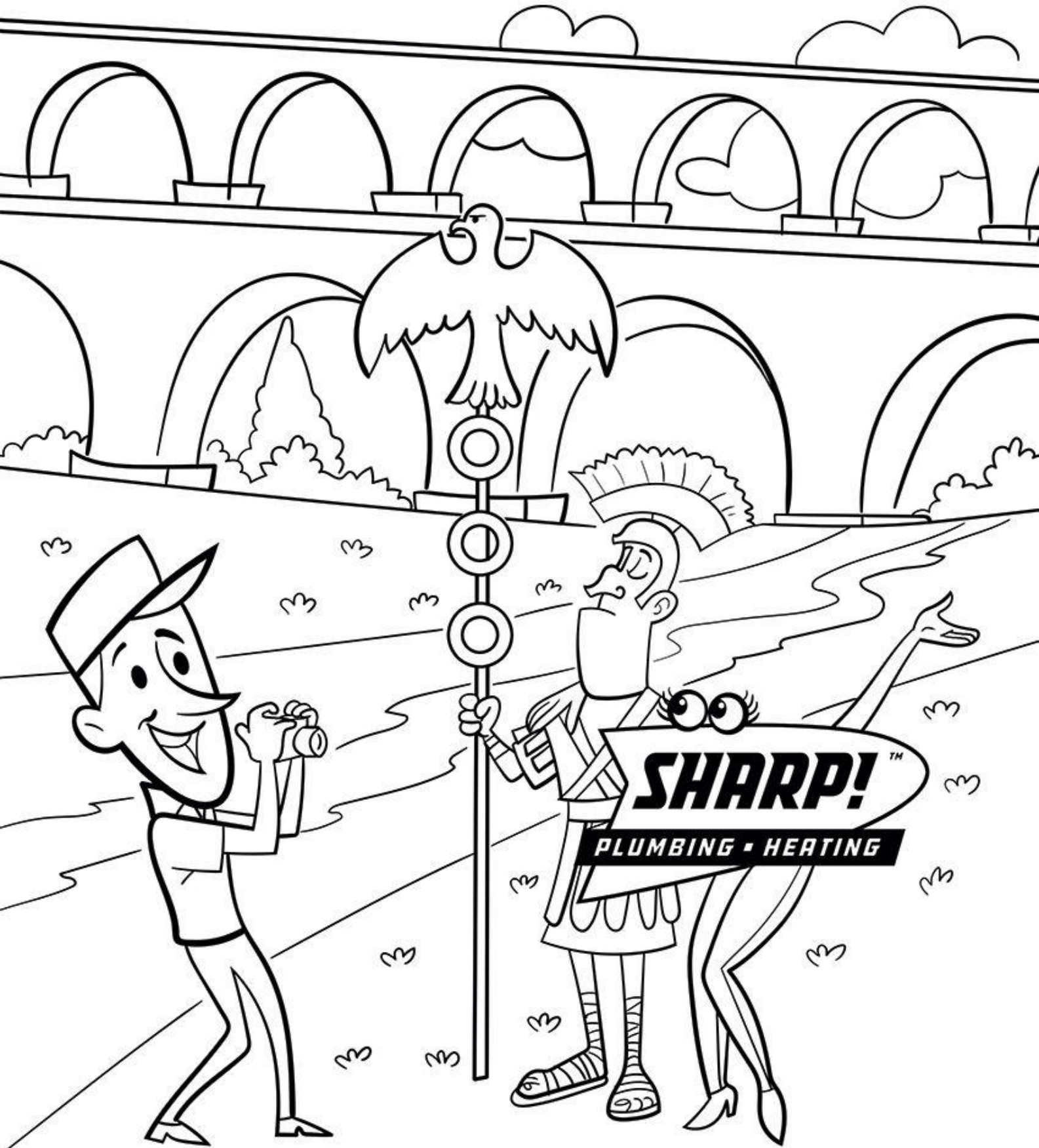

We are Sharppy and Bubble!



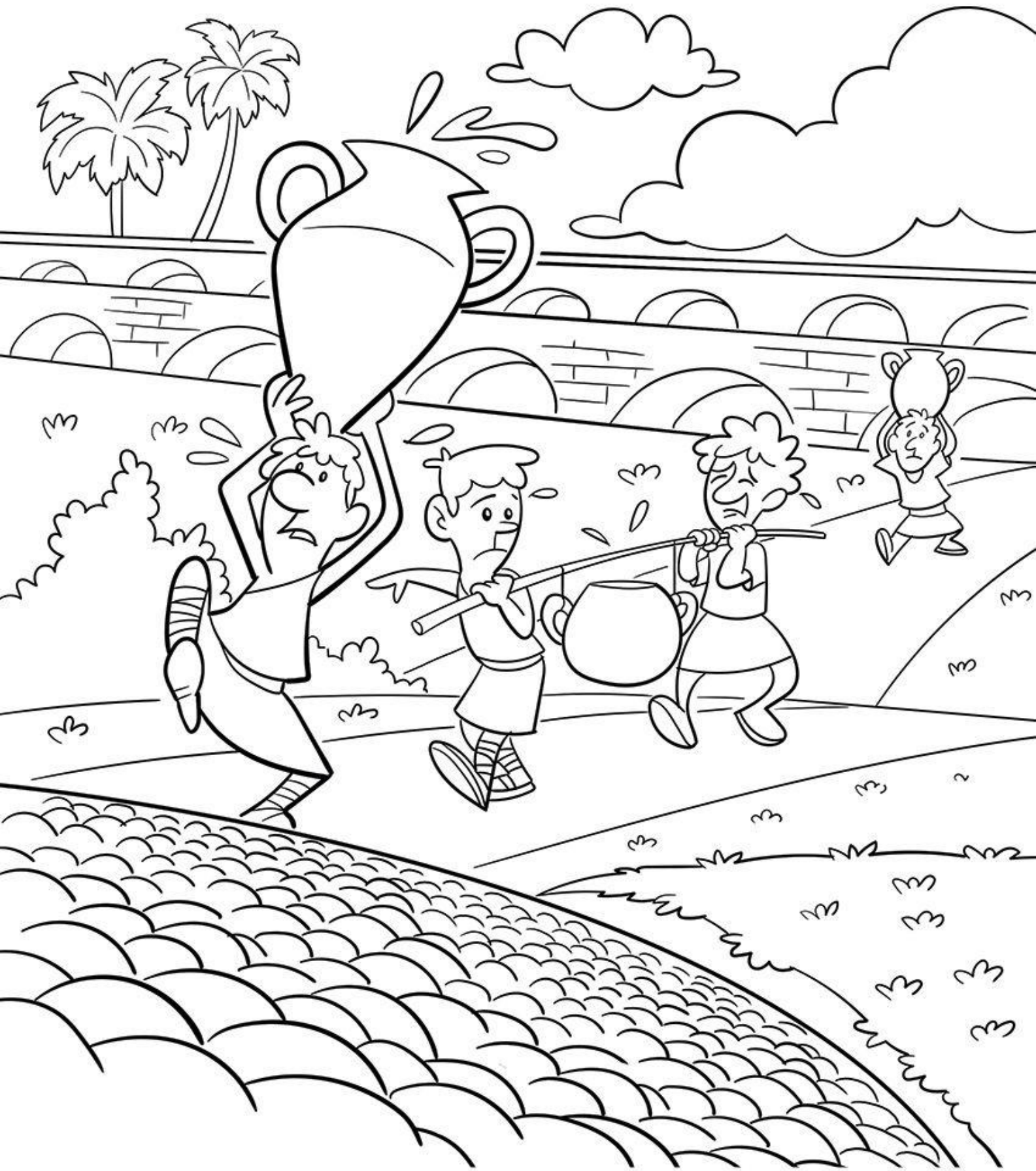
Together we are here to let you know,

They looked like bridges and were all handmade.



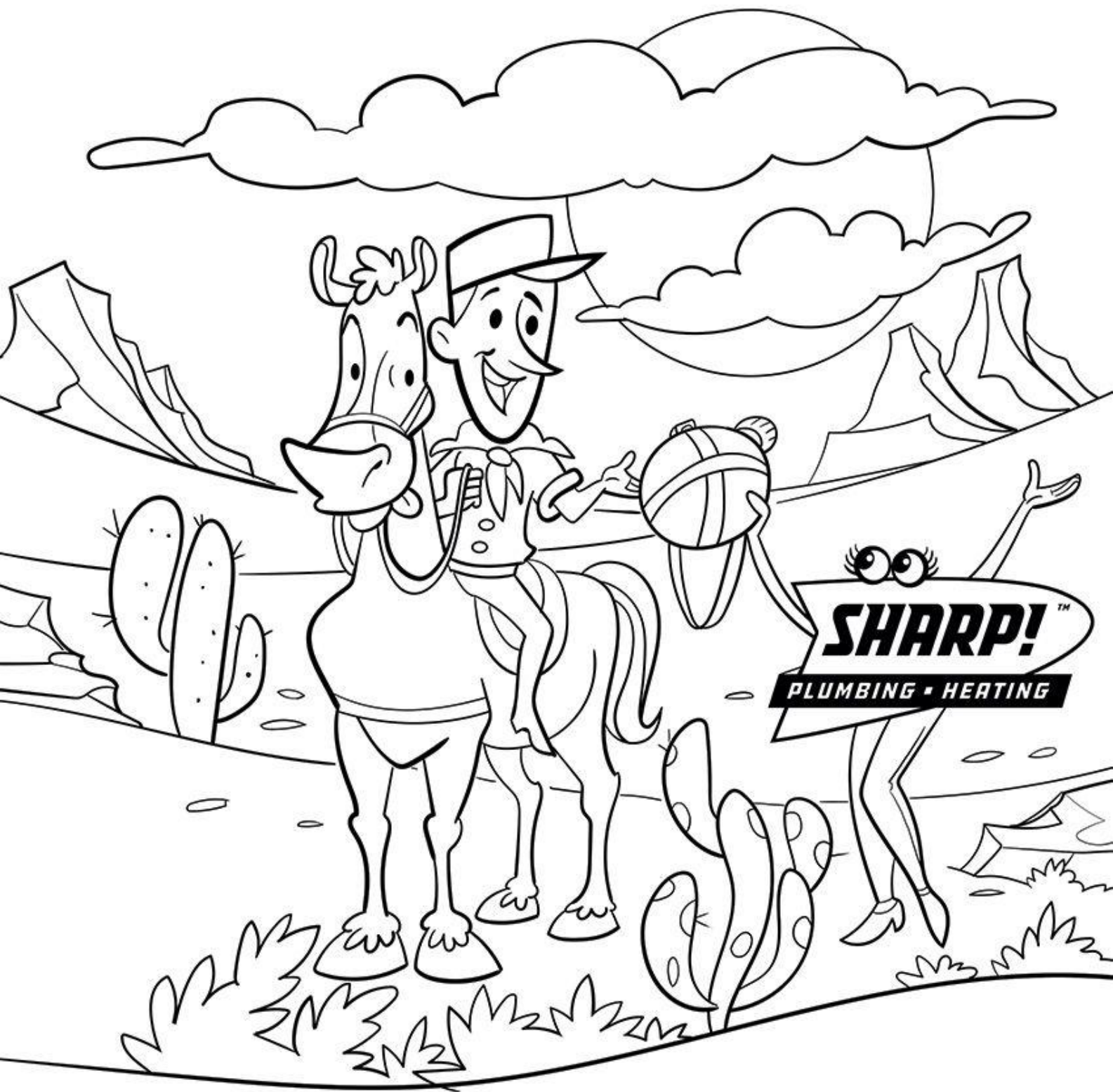
They were called Aqueducts and carried water from town to town.
